# Ribera del Duero 2022 Top 100


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# Introduction

One of the highlights of my year is the fortnight I spend in Ribera del Duero at the start of September. The smells and sights of summer are still apparent, but you can sense that autumn and the forthcoming harvest are approaching. This year there was a bonus, if that's the right word, as grapes were being picked all around me. The early start was the result of one of the driest and hottest growing seasons on record. I was, as it were, in the thick of it, chatting to winemakers, pickers and viticulturists on the ground, as I love to do, at an historic moment.

This is the sixth year that I've selected my favourite Ribera del Dueros at the invitation of the local Consejo Regulador. (The final choice, I should add, is entirely my own, with no outside influence whatsoever.) The 12-day, fact-finding visit that I did earlier this year was my longest and most intense trip yet. All in all, I tasted a record 578 wines from 160 bodegas, visiting nearly half of them in person. I also spent two mornings entirely dedicated to vineyards with Francisco Barona and Enrique Macias of Vega Sicilia.

Ribera del Duero is predominantly a red wine region, of course, with Tinto Fino the dominant grape. But it also makes rosés, or claretes – indeed, this was the region's dominant wine style as recently as the 1970s – and, since the 2019 vintage, has included white wines based on the local Albillo Mayor grape under the Denominación de Origen. There were five of these in this year's Top 100, with several very different styles on offer.

Ribera del Duero is a famously extreme, even marginal area, which has one of the shortest growing seasons on the planet. Frosts are not unheard of in June and the harvest is normally completed by mid-October, or earlier in hotter vintages. There is considerable variation from one year to the next, which is as much a strength as a weakness in a fine wine region, where consumers prize quality and an expression of place above consistency. The four vintages that dominate this year's Top 100 are a case in point. 2020 (35 wines) was fresh and comparatively moderate, 2019 (32 wines) was hot, dry, but balanced, while 2018 (13 wines) was a cooler, so called "Atlantic" vintage. 2017 (10 wines), meanwhile, was something of a paradox: hit by a devastating frost in late April, but also very warm during most of the growing season. Apart from these four vintages, there are wines from 2016, 2015, 2014, 2013, 2004 and 2003 in my selection. There is also a single Non-Vintage blend from Vega Sicilia.

All of the wines in the Top 100 scored 94 points or more and three achieved 98 points. Every year, I am heartened by the general shift in style – at least among the top producers – towards greater elegance, freshness and balance and away from power, alcohol and reliance on colour and oak rather than fruit and acidity. Ribera del Duero's wines are increasingly made like tea, not coffee.

There has been a degree of evolution, once more, among the bodegas represented in the Top 100. Some producers have been there since the start – how can you create such a list without Dominio de Es, Dominio de Pingus, Hermanos Pérez Pascuas, Hermanos Sastre and Vega Sicilia, for instance? – but there are additions every year. Six notable newcomers in 2022 are Abadía San Quirce, Casa Detilio, Casa Lebai, Familia Fernández Rivera, Sei Solo and Tomás Postigo, who join the four bodegas that featured for the

first time last year, and are there again in 2022: Francisco Barona, Mélida Wines, Quinta Milú and the joint venture of Rafael García and Raúl Tamayo. It's great to watch the DO evolve.

One last trend that I would again like to highlight is the growing trend towards village and parcel specific wines. Some of the best Riberas are blended across the region – Aalto, Ausàs and Garmón being three top examples – but a growing number reflect individual terroirs and communes. As people learn more about Ribera del Duero, so they will learn to recognise the differences between wines from, say, Anguix, Aranda and Atauta, or Moradillo de Roa, Nava de Roa and Roa itself. The next step will be the recognition of the very best sites, possibly as the equivalent of Burgundy's Grands Crus. For now, this is some way off, but a meaningful map of the region's terroirs is long overdue.

The more information they have, the more consumers and wine specialists will understand the complexity and diversity of Ribera del Duero. What happens in the cellar will always influence the finished wine, but, as estate agents are always telling us, it's location, location, location that really counts.

I hope you enjoy tasting the wines from my 2022 Ribera Top 100 as much as I did selecting them.

# **Tasting notes**

## Reds



#### Bodegas Valdaya Mirum Cosecha 2020

(14.5%) Croat sites

Great sites make great wines in the right hands. Las Piedras, an isolated, 80-year-old, limestone-based vineyard at 925 metres in cooler climate Baños de Valdearados, supplies the fruit for this world-class Tinto Fino from one of Ribera del Duero's most exciting producers. Intensely perfumed, with thyme and fennel scents, filigree tannins, crunchy plum and black cherry flavours and refined 25% new oak. Simply delicious from Marta Ramas and Miguel Fisac. 2024-35



#### Dominio de Pingus Pingus Cosecha 2020

(14%) A brilliant wine that deserves its global reputation, Pingus uses grapes from two plots in La Horra - Barroso (three hectares) and San Cristóbal (one hectare) – and shows no sign of the higher yields of the 2020 vintage. Fermented with 20% whole bunches and entirely aged in older wood, it's a floral, refined, gracefully structured Tinto Fino showing svelte tannins, mint, raspberry and black cherry fruit, racy acidity and subtle wood. "It's not about fireworks," says Peter Sisseck. Maybe. But it's certainly about balance, beauty and finesse. 2025-35



#### Vega Sicilia Único Reserva Especial (2023 Release) Reserva NV

(14%) The 2023

The 2023 release of this non-vintage specific red wines is a cuvée of 2009, 2011 and 2012 and is another superb release from Ribera del Duero's most celebrated bodega, making the most of a trio of very good harvests. Savoury and autumnal, this is a wine to sip by an open fire listening to good music: contemplative and refined. Marrying Tinto Fino with 6% Cabernet Sauvignon in this iteration, it's scented, sweet and balsamic, with detailed tannins, leafy tannins, supple wild strawberry fruit and an appealing volatile lift. The closest Ribera gets to a Gran Reserva Rioja in style. 2022-35



#### Bodegas Áster Finca El Otero Cosecha 2019

(14.5%)

For my money, this is the best release yet of Finca El Otero, a Tinto Fino which now ranks among the region's very best wines. Wonderfully floral and engaging, with stylish oak and fine-grained tannins, flavours of green herbs, fennel, blackberry and oregano, some stony reduction and a tangy, chiselled finish. A superb effort from the La Rioja Alta team. 2024-35



#### **Dominio de Atauta La Mala Cosecha 2017** (14%)

"Our most mineral terroir" is Jaime Suárez's description of La Mala, the coldest and latest picked of his single site reds. Ten sub-parcels of east-facing, pre-phylloxera vines on sandy clay soils make up the 0.7 hectares here. Wild, dense and savoury, this has the concentration of its low-yielding site, tapenade, garrigue and black fruit flavours and a balanced, vibrantly refreshing finish. 2025-35



#### Dominio de Es La Diva Cosecha 2020

(13.31%)

La Diva is one of Ribera del Duero's and Spain's greatest red wines. Sourced from the 0.3-hectare Paraje de Valdegatiles, a pre-phylloxera, ungrafted parcel at 950 metres, it's a nuanced, almost Burgundian take on high-altitude Tinto Fino, with 5% Albillo Mayor for good measure. Nuanced, floral and silky, with rose petal and patisserie aromas, svelte tannins, lots of racy acidity and a long, tapering, chalky finish. 2025-35



#### Dominio del Aguila Canta La Perdiz Cosecha 2019

(14.5%)

Canta La Perdiz is a small, 1.26-hectare parcel on clay and sandstone topsoils over a limestone base and produces the finest and most mineral of Jorge Monzón's reds. Marrying Tinto Fino with 5% of other grapes, it has rose petal and forest floor aromas, subtle minerality, wild strawberry fruit and an underlying grip that is almost Nebbiolo like. 2024-35



#### Francisco Barona Finca Las Dueñas Cosecha 2018

#### (14.5%)

Finca Las Duenas comes from a gnarly, old-vine parcel in Anguix that was planted in 1928. A field blend of Tinto Fino with lesser quantities of Albillo Mayor, Bobal and Garnacha, it carries its new French oak lightly. Incense, clove and ginger spice aromas are the gateway to a rich, layered, concentrated palate of cassis, blackberry and Mediterranean herbs. Still youthful, with plenty of gas in the tank. 2025-35



#### Pago de los Capellanes Parcela El Nogal Cosecha 2003

(14%)

This was the first ever vintage of El Nogal, but there's still some available as a re-release, so I'm more than happy to include it here, especially as it has aged so wonderfully. There's no sign of the heat of the 2003 growing season on this sweet, complex, autumnal red, showing notes of leather, forest floor and tobacco leaf, sweet spices and layers of wild strawberry and wild mushroom. Delicious stuff. 2022-27



#### Vega Sicilia Valbuena 5 Reserva 2018

#### (14.5%)

Produced entirely with estate fruit since the 1996 vintage, Valbuena combines Tinto Fino with 4% Merlot that's planted in the lower part of the farm close to the Duero river. Showing the structure and focus of the 2018 vintage, this is a scented, complex, savoury red that's just starting to get into its stride, with Mediterranean herb scents, fine tannins and some underlying grip and minerality. 2025-35



#### Vega Sicilia Único Reserva 2013

#### (14%)

This vintage of Único may not make very old bones, but it's a delight to drink now and will continue to evolve for at least another decade. Reflecting the cooler, wetter growing season in 2013, it's a graceful, perfumed, balsamic Tinto Fino with earth and tobacco leaf aromas, sweet, almost gamey fruit and a leafy undertone from 3% Cabernet Sauvignon. 2023-35



#### Bodegas Félix Callejo Félix Callejo Cosecha 2020

(14.5%)

Bearing a photo of Félix Callejo, who is still on hand to supervise the harvest at the winery he founded, this is a sublime expression of high-altitude Tinto Fino from two parcels - Medio Arroyo and Montecillo - between 900 and 920 metres. Serious, but far from a blockbuster, it's a wine that carries its new oak lightly, with black cherry and blueberry fruit, fine oak and a tapering finish. 2024-35



#### Bodegas Félix Callejo Majuelos de Callejo Cosecha 2020

(14.5%)

Majuelos - a term used to describe small, family-owned parcels in the past - hails from three vineyards in Sotillo de la Ribera (Camposanto, Medio Arroyo and Arenales), all of which are located on deeper soils. Aged in deftly integrated new French oak, it's a wonderfully elegant Tinto Fino with redcurrant and red cherry flavours, chalky freshness and subtle wood spices. 2024-32



#### Bodegas Garmón Contintental Garmón Cosecha 2020

(14.5%)

Eduardo García sources grapes from seven different villages - Anguix, Baños de Valdearados, La Aguilera, Moradillo, Olivares, Tubilla del Lago and Valbuena - to make this superb pan-Ribera blend, which deserves its reputation as one of the region's very best releases. Fresh, elegant and youthful, with fennel and wild herb aromas, lots of zip and acidity and medium structure. Subtle, refined and ethereal. 2025-35



#### **Bodegas Marta Maté Los Perejiles Cosecha 2020**

#### (14%)

Los Perejiles hails from a single 0.5-hectare parcel of the same name in Tubilla del Lago, planted over 100 years ago. Now in its second vintage, this marries Tempranillo and 5% Albillo Mayor and is wonderfully fresh, bright and concentrated, with zesty plum and blueberry fruit, lots of chalky intensity and levels of acidity that speak of its cool origin. 2025-35



#### Bodegas Marta Maté Marta Maté Cosecha 2019

(13.7%)

Delicious: there's only one word to describe this remarkable wine, which acts as a counterblast to anyone who thinks all Riberas are big and overwooded. Combining grapes from Tubilla del Lago and 10% from Gumiel de Mercado, it wouldn't look out of place in Bierzo. Scented and refined, with plum, black cherry and summer pudding flavours, sculpted tannins and a bright, refreshing finish. 2023-30



#### Bodegas Valdaya Cosecha 2020

#### (14.5%)

Valdaya's brilliant red uses grapes from four sites in Baños de Valdearados - Arenal del Monte, La Esparraguera, Los Arenales and Valdaya - to produce one of Ribera del Duero's most refined and elegant reds. Described as an "infusion" by Marta Ramas, it's a fresh, detailed, high-altitude style with subtle reduction, mountain herb aromas, clementine and black cherry fruit and a whisper of oak. 2024-32



#### Bodegas y Viñedos Gallego Zapatero Yotuel Finca de San Miguel Cosecha 2015

(14.5%)

Of all the Yotuel single parcels, San Miguel is the one with the most clay and tends to make the densest and most concentrated wine. Compact and what Béquer Prieto calls "monolithic", this comes from a 0.65-hectare, north-facing site and has lots of weight and volume, thyme and lavender top notes and the focus, grip and intensity to age. 2023-30



#### **Bodegas y Viñedos Gallego Zapatero Yotuel Finca Valdepalacios** Cosecha 2018

(14.5%)

Valdepalacios is the jewel in Yotuel's crown: a one-hectare plot of bush vines that was planted nearly 80 years ago. Showing the freshness of the 2018 vintage, albeit in a warm, south eastfacing site, this is complex, floral and ethereal, with bright, racy acidity, violet and potpourri aromas, chalky minerality and engagingly savoury tannins. 2023-32



#### **Dominio de Atauta Valdegatilles Cosecha 2017**

(14%)

Valdegatilles is the lowest of Dominio de Atauta's vineyard-focused wines, although it's still located at a pretty elevated 930 metres. North-facing and entirely clay based, it's often the most backward of the bodega's red, with a low pH and the concentration and acidity to age. Grippy, focused and tight, with sturdy tannins, lots of concentration and layers of damson, blueberry and wet earth. 2026-35



#### Dominio de Es Carravilla Cosecha 2020

#### (12.0%)

Carravilla is a brilliant single site 0.27-hectare blend of Tinto Fino and 5% Albillo Mayor, showcasing vines planted at 935 metres more than a century ago. South-facing - unusually for Atauta - on very white, limestone rich soils, it has rose petal and peony aromas, lots of chalky vivacity, redcurrant, plum and bramble fruit flavours and a subtle frame of older oak. The acidity is very vibrant on the finish. 2025-32



#### Dominio del Aguila Peñas Aladas Gran Reserva 2015

(14%)

Peñas Aladas is a 3.5-hectare plot in La Aguilera from which Jorge Monzón selects the best barrels each year. It's an extreme site - one of the coldest in Burgos, as it happens - that ripens late. Whole bunch fermented, this is a stylish, age worthy cuvée of Tinto Fino and 5% other red and white grapes, with pine, violet and rosemary aromas, subtle wood integration, savoury tannins and a tangy, chalky finish. 2023-32



#### Francisco Barona Cosecha 2020

(15%)Francisco Barona is one of the most exciting young producers in Ribera del Duero right now. This blend of mostly Tinto Fino with Bobal, Garnacha and various white varieties, comes from old vine parcels in Anguix, La Aguilera, La Horra and Roa is typically plush, scented and complex. Incense, rosemary and wild thyme aromas segue into a full-bodied, well-

structured, dark-fruited palate that's textured and energetic, despite its 15% alcohol. 2025-35



### Hacienda Monasterio Reserva 2018 (15%)

"A wonderful vintage" is how Peter Sisseck describes 2018 at Hacienda Monasterio, a property that often performs best in cooler, more Atlantic growing seasons. Made with Tinto Fino on limestone and 20% Cabernet Sauvignon on gravel soils, both of them planted in 1990, this is a deliciously complex, nuanced red with pine and tobacco pouch aromas, notes of incense, graphite and wild strawberry and a leafy lift of acidity. 2025-35



#### Hermanos Sastre Pesus Selección de Pedro y Jesús Cosecha 2016

(15%) Since its first release in 1999, Pesus has established itself as one of the most sought after reds in Ribera del Duero. Marrying Tinto Fino with 15% Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon, with ageing in 200% new oak, this is a wonderful expression of the power of La Horra: rich and concentrated, but not overwhelmed by wood or alcohol. Dense, well-structured and polished,

with cassis, blueberry, cinnamon and violet notes and a fresh, satisfying finish. 2025-38



#### Magna Vides Bancales del Sardal Cosecha 2020

(13.5%)

What a début this is, representing the epitome of new wave, vineyard-focused Ribera del Duero from an exciting young operation. Combining Tinto Fino with co-planted Albillo Mayor, fermented with 100% whole bunches, it's an effortlessly complex red: wild, savoury and herbal with sage and rosemary flavours, sinewy tannins and understated complexity. 2024-32



#### Magna Vides Viña del Cuadrón Cosecha 2019

#### (13.5%)

Andrea Sanz and Pablo Arranz keep pulling new single parcel wines out of the hat and they are invariably among the most exciting wines in Ribera del Duero. Viña del Cuadrón is "young" by the standards of some of their vineyards, at only 60 years' old, but this is another triumph, sourced from a limestone-rich site at 900 metres in Quintana del Pidio. Spicy and intense, with bramble, rosemary and balck cherry flavours and a subtle oak backdrop. 2024-32



#### Montebaco Parcela Cara Norte Cosecha 2019

#### (14.5%)

Is Cara Norte the best value wine in Ribera del Duero? It's surely in the top one, as the English football manager Brian Clough once put it. Ludicrously cheap at €17, it comes from a dry-farmed vineyard that was planted in 1998 and is flourishing without irrigation. Fresh, yet concentrated with mountain herb aromas, redcurrant, black olive and liquorice flavours, stylish 20% new wood and a pure, ethereal finish. 2025-35



#### Pago de los Capellanes Parcela El Nogal Cosecha 2018

#### (15%)

El Nogal is a single 45-year-old parcel planted in Mambrilla de Castrejón that consistently produces one of Ribera del Duero's most impressive wines. Located on sand and clay soils, it naturally yields small and intensely flavoured bunches. Pine and garrigue scented, this is a plush, full-throttle expression of Tinto Fino that is not without underlying elegance. Fleshy, textured and sweetly oaked in new French barrels. 2024-30



#### Rafael García y Raúl Tamayo Acediano Cosecha 2019

(24.5%)

Acediano is a brilliant single-parcel Tinto Fino from a one-hectare site in Nava de Roa. First produced in 2011, it has achieved new levels of concentration and complexity in 2019. Perfumed, detailed and refined, with lovely focus, chalky minerality, vibrant black cherry and blueberry fruit, scented oak and a long, balanced finish. 2024-35



#### Viñedos y Bodegas García Figuero Milagros de Figuero Cosecha 2019

#### (14.5%)

A lighter hand in the winery, old vines and only 50% new wood resulted in one of the bestever releases of Milagros in 2019. Sourced from the sandy, stony soils of the Paraje del Camino de los Frailes in the southern part of La Horra, it's floral, ethereal and detailed, with tobacco leaf and summer pudding fruit, scented oak, savoury tannins and a long, satisfying finish. 2024-35



#### Viñedos y Bodegas García Figuero Tinto Figuero Noble Cosecha 2018

#### (15.5%)

The clay, sand and limestone soils of the Parcela de Torrosillo, situated at 865 metres in the southern part of La Horra, closer to the Duero River, are the sole source of this stylish, focused, age worthy Tinto Fino from a rapidly improving bodega. Orange peel and cigar box aromas segue into a palate of oregano, thyme, bramble and blackberry. 2024-35



#### Ausàs Interpretación Cosecha 2020 (15%)

2020 marks the fifth vintage of ex-Vega Sicilia winemaker Xavier Ausàs' own project and continues the run of impressive releases. Based on grapes from his own vineyards in Nava de Roa, with the remaining 60% sourced from growers in Gumiel de Mercado, Moradillo de Roa and Roa itself, this is a plush, perfumed, well-balanced Tinto Fino, with aromas of Asian spices and chocolate, a palate of tangerine and blackberry, supple tannins and an undertow of acidity. 2024-32



#### **Bodegas Briego Gran Reserva 2014**

#### (15%)

People who enjoy traditional, barrel and bottle-matured Riojas will love this delicious Gran Reserva Ribera, which is showing beautifully eight years after the cooler, more Atlantic harvest. Perfumed and elegant, with notes of truffle and autumn leaves, sweet aniseed, Asian spice and wild strawberry flavours, graceful tannins and supporting acidity. 2023-32



#### Bodegas Hermanos Pérez Pascuas Pérez Pascuas Gran Reserva 2017

(14.5%)

The top red wine from Pérez Pascuas is a small volume release of just 2,400 bottles, all sourced from the Finca Valtarreña at 838 metres. The crop was reduced by frost in 2017, but there's none of the under-ripe/over-ripe characters that you find in some expressions of the vintage. Dense, compact and serious, with plenty of toasty French and American oak, blackberry and damson fruit and understated power. 2024-35



#### **Bodegas Hermanos Pérez Pascuas Viña Pedrosa Reserva 2019** (14.5%)

The Viña Pedrosa Reserva uses grapes from the Finca Prado El Carril at 843 metres and features the classic Pérez Pascuas combination of French and 60% American oak. You can almost taste the limestone in the soils here, as well as the concentration of the old vine fruit. Grippy and built to age, this has notes of tobacco leaf and sweet spices, a tannic backbone and a plush mid-palate. 2024-32



#### Bodegas Marta Maté Raspón Cosecha 2019

(14%)

The second release of Marta Castrillo and César Maté's Raspón is every bit as good as the 2016, sourced from a biodynamic vineyard at 930 metres in Gumiel de Meracdo. If your impression of Ribera reds is that they're big, oaky and inky, this will come as a surprise, being closer to a red Burgundy in style. Picked late so that the stems are lignified, it's a fine, focused, graceful delight, with some clove spice, sappy red cherry and raspberry fruit and the faintest hint of oak. Delicious. 2023-29



#### **Bodegas Monteabellón Finca La Blanquera Cosecha 2018** (14.5%)

La Blanquera is one of the most spectacular sites in Ribera del Duero, located on chalky white slopes at 950 metres above Nava de Roa. Barrel-fermented in new French oak, it's rich, dense, chiselled and focused, with layers of fennel, cinnamon and blackberry, fine-grained tannins and a vibrant, refreshing finish. 2025-35



#### Bodegas Valtravieso Gran Valtravieso Cosecha 2019

#### (15.5%)

Savoury, intense and wild, this is a very unusual Tinto Fino from clay and limestone soils on the páramo of Piñel de Arriba. Fermented with 25% whole bunches for extra structure and perfume, it's earthy and herbal, with notes of truffle, autumn leaves and clove, sweet oak and plenty of zip and acidity for a wine with 15.5% alcohol. 2023-27



#### Bodegas Valtravieso VT Tinto Fino Cosecha 2020

(14.5%)

The brilliant Ricardo Velasco makes this varietal Tinto Fino with grapes from a 25-year-old parcel called Valdelobas, located high on the páramo of Piñel de Arriba. Aged in 20% new wood, it's one of the freshest and most refined reds in the Denominación de Origen, all violet, dill and oregano on the nose, complemented by a palate of cassis, capsicum and fine-grained tannins. 2024-32



#### Bodegas Vizcarra Celia Cosecha 2018

(14.5%)

Named after one of Juan Carlos Vizcarra's daughters - she's now a qualified oenologist too - Celia is a cuvée of Tinto Fino and 7% Garnacha. Engagingly scented and well balanced, with aromas of liquorice, violet and five spice, impressive structure and depth, patisserie, blackberry and red cherry flavours and haunting palate length. 2024-35



#### Casa Lebai Matadiablos Cosecha 2019

#### (13.5%)

A great name - devil killer - and an equally impressive wine, this medium-bodied Tinto Fino comes from an 82-year-old parcel of the same name in Gumiel de Mercado. You can taste the cooler climate of the higher part of Burgos in the grapes here, with very nuanced oak from ageing in foudres, smooth, granular tannins, lots of zip and acidity and crunchy red cherry and bramble fruit. 2024-30



#### Conde de San Cristóbal Oydor Cosecha 2019

(14.5%)

Oydor is something of an outlier in the Conde de San Cristóbal range, as it's sourced from two parcels totalling 0.5 hectares in Quintana del Pidio rather than the bodega's home estate near Peñafiel. Wild, savoury and complex, with appealing weight and intensity, notes of rosemary and lavender, smooth tannins and a balanced, nuanced finish. 2024-35



#### Dominio Basconcillos Viña Magna Reserva 2019

(15.5%)

The 2019 release is the best yet from this pioneering bodega in Gumiel de Izán, with a beautiful balance between oak, fruit, acidity and tannic structure. Marrying Tinto Fino with 10% Cabernet Sauvignon and 5% Merlot, it handles its new French oak with aplomb. Subtle mocha aromas segue into a palate that's floral, refined and polished, with fine-grained tannins, plum and black cherry flavours and a herbal twist. 2024-35

#### Dominio de Atauta La Roza Cosecha 2017

(14.5%)

Three sub-parcels with a remarkable average age of 170 years make up the 0.24 hectares that are used to make La Roza. The soils are slightly deeper here, with 50cm of sand and clay over a bedrock of limestone. Structured, wild and slightly salty, with undertones of kelp and green malt, layers of damson, plum skin and blackberry fruit and a firm, structured, age worthy palate freshened by chalky minerality. 2025-35



#### Dominio de Atauta Llanos del Almendro Cosecha 2017

#### (14%)

Llanos del Almendro is one of five single parcel wines at Dominio de Atauta, made with no fewer than 19 micro-parcels that add up to 1.39 hectares. The most perfumed, chiselled and elegant of the quintet, this is fresh, vibrant and electric, with rosemary and sage aromas, chalky minerality, a hint of umami and racy redcurrant and strawberry flavours. 2024-35



#### Dominio de Cair Cruz del Pendón Cosecha 2016

(14.5%)

An impressive follow up to the 2015 release, reflecting the cooler conditions and larger yields of the 2016 vintage, Cruz del Pendón features Tinto Fino from the Eustasio, La Cruz Vieja and Nava Vieja parcels, all three of which are over 85 years' old. Ferrous, yet very fresh, with well-integrated, second-use French oak, racy plum and red cherry fruit and a dusting of Mediterranean herbs. 2024-30



#### **Dominio de Cair Pendón de La Aguilera Cosecha 2019** (14.5%)

"We've got some of the best grapes in the area, so why hide them with oak?" asks Álvaro Izquierdo, providing music for my ears. This superb wine comes from two parcels in La Aguilera - Aguila and Carrevilla - that were both planted in the 1920s. Perfumed and ethereal, with gentle ageing in 500-litre barrels, pine and oregano top notes, raspberry and red cherry fruit and refreshing minerality. 2024-32



#### Dominio de Pingus Flor de Pingus Cosecha 2020

#### (14%)

Flor is what Peter Sisseck calls "my village wine", sourced from La Horra with a smidgeon from Olmedillo. Featuring 3% Grenache for the first time, as well as 0.5% of white grapes, it's a gentle, precise, beautifully balanced red, with granular tannins, plum, liquorice and wild strawberry flavours and a subtle, palate-caressing finish. 2024-30



#### **Dominio Fournier Reserva 2019**

#### (14.5%)

It's a pleasure to see Dominio Fournier back on form with a wine as good as this one. Sourced from older vines on this Berlangas de Roa estate, it's a rich, perfumed, full-bodied Tinto Fino with stylish 50% new French oak, impressive structure and density, notes of wild herbs and graphite and lots of youthful bramble and blackberry fruit. Layered and complex. And up a point with an extra year in bottle. 2023-32



#### **Grupo Yllera Vivaltus Cosecha 2019**

(14%)

It's hard to believe that 2019 is only the fourth release of Vivaltus, such has been the brand's success in a short space of time. This is a judicious blend of Tinto Fino with 0.93% Merlot and 0.15% Cabernet Sauvignon that aspires to greatness. This vintage won't be released for another two years, and needs time to shed some reduction in bottle, but it's already wonderfully textured and nuanced, with chocolate, fresh herbs and summer berry fruit, deftly handled oak and appealing balance. 2025-35



#### Hacienda Solano Finca Peña Lobera Cosecha 2019

(14.5%)

Volumes are small at only 1,900 bottles from this 0.4-hectare parcel of Tinto Fino and 2% Albillo Mayor, but the quality is so good that the resulting wine is well worth tracking down. Planted over a century ago, it's a special site at 870 metres and has produced a scented, balanced, refreshing stunner in 2019, all chalky minerality, intense summer berry fruit and understated mountain herbs. 2024-32



#### M. Chapoutier España Dominio del Soto Gran Reserva 2019

#### (14.5%)

Part of an increasingly impressive range from Ernesto Penã's biodynamically farmed vineyards in and around Sotillo, this Gran Reserva hails from a single 1.16-hectare parcel. Subtle, understated and refined, it's very much a higher altitude Burgos style, with wild herb and red berry flavours, chalky minerality and graceful tannins. 2024-35



#### Pago de Carraovejas El Anejón Cosecha 2018

(15.5%)

El Anejón is an eight-hectare amphitheatre that faces the castle of Peñafiel and has been part of the Pago de Carraovejas range since 2009. Marrying Tinto Fino with 12% Cabernet Sauvignon and 7% Merlot, this is a ripe, full-bodied style, even in a cooler, wetter year like 2018, but the power and concentration are framed by attractive oak, with dense plum, liquorice and mulberry flavours and the structure to age. 2025-35



#### Quinta Milú El Malo Cosecha 2019

(14%)

El Malo used to be a single vineyard wine, but is now a cuvée of various parcels - Bellavista, La del Paco, La Selva and Transconvento - with an average age of 85 years. The most accomplished wine in the current range, this has lavender and wild thyme aromas, sweetly integrated oak, sinewy tannins and spicy blackberry fruit intensity. 2024-32



#### Sei Solo Bodegas y Viñedos Preludio de Sei Solo Cosecha 2015 (15%)

Sei Solo is based in Roa de Duero, but sources this exceptional wine from parcels with an average age of 30 years in La Horra. Javier Zaccagnini, one of the founders of Aalto, has kept some bottles of this vintage back to illustrate its ageing potential. Sweet, leafy and complex, with scented, spicy oak, fine-grained tannins and a sweet core of bramble and wild strawberry fruit. Has the potential to develop further delights in bottle. 2022-29

#### Valdemonjas Abrí Las Alas Cosecha 2020

Abrí Las Alas is the most structured and serious wine at Valdemonjas, produced from an 85-year-old, 0.56-hectare parcel on red clay soils in La Horra. Ferrous, dense and grippy, it has stylish 50% new wood, floral top notes, orange zest and damson fruit and fresh underlying acidity. Beautifully balanced with good ageing potential. 2023-32



#### Viñedos Alonso del Yerro María de Alonso del Yerro Cosecha 2019 (14%)

Alonso del Yerro's top wine, named after its charming owner, combines equal parts of two of the estate's parcels in Roa: El Circo on red clay soils and Violeta on gravel, sand and chalk. Enticingly perfumed, with scents of rose petal and potpourri, subtle 20% new French oak and layers of pomegranate, tangerine and red berries. 2024-35



#### Aalto Bodegas y Viñedos Aalto Cosecha 2020

#### (14.5%)

Aalto is the most celebrated example of a pan-Ribera red, using grapes from nine different villages in Burgos and Valladolid over a period of three weeks. The 2020 is typically rich, dense and well-upholstered, with a stylish mix of one third new French and American oak, some mocha sweetness, bright acidity and classic liquorice, tar and blackberry fruit intensity. Will age well, too. 2024-32



#### Aalto Bodegas y Viñedos Aalto PS Cosecha 2020

(15%)

PS is Aalto's icon wine, produced from 60 to 90-year-old parcels in the prime villages of La Aguilera and La Horra. Given the full new French oak treatment, this is wonderfully scented and concentrated, with prominent toast and cinnamon aromas, glossy tannins, layers of chocolate, damson and blueberry and the density to age. 2025-35



#### Abadía de San Quirce Finca Helena Cosecha 2019

(15.5%)

The quality of this single site, 100-year-old vineyard in La Aguilera really shines through on the nose and palate. Peppery, fresh and spicy, with deftly integrated new French oak, bramble and raspberry fruit, a backbone of tannin and racy acidity. Has the concentration to age. 2023-30



#### Alión Cosecha 2019

(15%)

Alión is a pan-Ribera blend, using grapes spread over 70 hectares, principally in the Burgos villages of La Aguilera, Moradillo de Roa and Roa. Aged in a combination of concrete and 70% new French and 5% American oak, this was picked early to counter the heat of the vintage. It's bright, focused and acid-driven, with scented wood and blueberry and black cherry fruit. Will age gracefully for a decade or more. 2024-35



#### **Bodegas Antídoto La Hormiga de Antídoto Cosecha 2020** (14.5%)

Hormiga combines grapes from around 50 parcels on the northern side of the Duero River, all of them planted on clay and limestone soils at over 950 metres. Seriously wooded in 54% new barrels, it unfurls flavours of liquorice, five spice and cinnamon on the palate, with plenty of grip and tannins, bramble and blackberry fruit and a ferrous undertone. 2024-32



#### **Bodegas Arzuaga Navarro Reserva Especial Reserva 2017** (14.8%)

This very impressive Reserva Especial bottling is a medley of Tinto Fino and 3% Albillo Mayor, all sourced from 80 to 100-year-old vineyards on clay and limestone soils in the province of Burgos. Inky yet not overly powerful or dense, it's a wine that combines concentration with freshness. Cassis and blackberry fruit flavours are framed by French oak, with 10% whole bunches adding extra nuance and structure. 2024-32



#### Bodegas Bohórquez Añada Especial Reserva 2004

(14%) There are still a few thousand bottles of this mature wine available and it's a steal at under

€40. Partnering Tinto Fino with 15% Cabernet Sauvignon, Añada Especial is a vindication of Javier Bohórquez's decision to plant vines at altitude in the late 1990s. Mature, graceful and balsamic, with forest floor and cured leather aromas, blackcurrant leaf and cigar box notes and wonderfully refined tannins. 2022-29



#### Bodegas El Lagar de Isilla El Lagar de Isilla Paraje Peñalobos Cosecha 2019

(14.5%)

El Lagar de Isilla's Paraje Peñalobos bottling uses grapes from three old-vine parcels in Peñaranda de Duero. Wonderfully pure, ethereal and graceful, particularly for a red with 14.5% alcohol, it benefits from the presence of 5% co-fermented Albillo Mayor. Rose petal and sweet spice aromas segue into a palate of dill, raspberry and pomegranate underpinned and freshened by chalky minerality. 2023-31



#### Bodegas Félix Callejo Finca Valderoble Cosecha 2020

#### (14.5%)

Finca Valderoble is located in what is known as the páramo, the high moorland areas of the region that have come into their own with climate change. Partnering Tinto Fino with 25% Merlot (one the highest components in Ribera del Duero), this is stony and refreshing, with chalky red cherry and raspberry flavours and a hint of graphite. The 50% new wood is extremely well integrated. 2023-30



### **Bodegas Hermanos Pérez Pascuas Finca La Navilla Reserva 2019** (14.5%)

Finca La Navilla is planted with the CL179 clone, which produces extremely concentrated bunches of Tinto Fino. Aged in new French oak, the result is a structured, intense red with fine tannins, some underlying grip, subtle wood, plenty of acidity and a core of plum, bramble and red berry fruit. A lovely expression of a special site. 2023-32



#### Bodegas La Horra Corimbo I Reserva 2017

(14.5%)

Corimbo I is the impressive, age worthy Grand Vin from Rioja winery Roda's outpost in Ribera del Duero. Combining grapes from parcels between 45 and 94 years' old on different soil types in the villages of Anguix, La Horra and Roa, it's floral, savoury and balsamic, with a stylish combination of French and 20% American oak and granular tannins. 2023-29



#### Bodegas Trus Punto Geodésico Cosecha 2020

(15%) A wine that carries its 15% alcohol lightly, this intense, vibrant, well-structured Tinto Fino uses raw material from the contrasting villages of Baños de Valdearados, La Aguilera, Moradillo de Roda and Peñaranda, all of them close to geodesic points. Lightly wooded in a combination of cement and 500-litre barrels, it's chalky and focused, with damson and black cherry fruit and serious, age worthy tannins. 2023-30



### **Bodegas Valtravieso VT Vendimia Seleccionada Cosecha 2020** (14.5%)

Lovers of classed growth Bordeaux would feel very at home tasting this elegant, beautifully weighted red from one of the coolest and highest spots in Valladolid. Fermented with 10% whole bunches and sourced from parcels on the páramo with a higher level of clay, this has graphite, cut grass and blackcurrant leaf flavours, bright acidity and silky tannins. 2025-35



#### Bodegas Viña Mayor Secreto 3 RB Cosecha 2020

(13.8%)

Has Almudena Albera MW surpassed herself in 2020? I think so. Picked early for freshness, before ageing in concrete and older 500-litre barrels, this is a very elegant expression of the El Almendro vineyard in La Horra, showing silky tannins, bright acidity and focus, rose petal top notes and layers of liquorice, strawberry and clove spice. 2023-30



#### Bodegas y Viñedos Gallego Zapatero Yotuel Finca La Nava Cosecha 2017

(14.5%)

The sandy clay soils of this 0.8-hectare vineyard, planted as recently as 1996, regularly produce one of the best reds in the Yotuel line up. It's another example of a very good 2017 bottling, reflecting the heat and frost of the vintage but also triumphing over them. Earthy and spicy, with umami and forest floor notes, graceful fruit and a volatile lift. 2022-27



#### Casa Detilio Finca Teso La Talda Cosecha 2020

(14%)

A wine that lives up to the quality of its package, this varietal Tinto Fino from Padilla de Duero has such a strong violet perfume that you could easily mistake it for a Malbec from Argentina's Uco Valley. Heavily influenced by its chalky terroir, this is fresh, plush and sumptuously oaked, with cassis and blackberry fruit and lovely weight and focus. 2023-30



#### Conde de San Cristóbal Reserva Especial Reserva 2020

(14.5%)

Conde de San Cristóbal's Reserva Especial is a single parcel Tinto Fino from the threehectare La Calvacha parcel at 900 metres. Concentrated yet elegant, with the classic freshness of páramo vines, plenty of toasty oak, some Mediterranean herb top notes, fine tannins and the structure and backbone to age in bottle. 2023-30



#### Dominio de Atauta San Juan Cosecha 2017

#### (14.5%)

San Juan is a small valley in Atauta, just 1.3km long and 0.5km wide. This pure Tinto Fino comes from south-facing slopes between 940 and 955 metres and the comparative warmth of the site shows in the wine. Lightly wooded and mountain herb-scented, with a balsamic undertone and notes of five spice, dark berry fruit, a firm backbone of tannin and chalky intensity 2025-35



#### Dominio de Es La Mata Cosecha 2020

(13%)

La Mata - not to be confused with Dominio de Atauta's nearby La Mala - is a 0.33-hectare Atauta parcel at 935 metres that faces east. Aged in new François Frères barrels, it needs several more years in bottle to soften and integrate the smoky oak, but give it time. Broad, dense and concentrated, with aromas of patisserie, bramble and raspberry, understated power and texture and good ageing potential. 2025-32



#### Dominio de Es Viñas Viejas de Soria Cosecha 2020

(12.85%)

Comparatively low in alcohol for a Ribera del Duero red - Bertrand Sourdais says that the high yields helped in 2020 - this old-vine cuvée of mostly Tinto Fino with a little Albillo Mayor and Alicante Bouschet is the only Dominio de Es wine to be fermented with (25%) whole bunches. Floral, refined and racy, it's a red that doffs its cap to Burgundy, with fine tannins, shimmering acidity and a core of crunchy minerality. 2024-30



#### Dominio del Aguila Reserva 2019

(14%)

Jorge Monzón's Reserva bottling makes full use of 20 different parcels of 100 year plus vineyards in his home village of La Aguilera. Partnering Tinto Fino with 5% of other grapes, it's rich, dense and concentrated, with thyme and rosemary aromas that give it a Mediterranean twist, bold tannins and notes of garrigue, iodine and black fig. 2024-32



#### Familia Fernández Rivera Janus Gran Reserva 2018

(14.9%)

Last made back in 2003, Janus is the icon wine from the Fernández family. Combining grapes from the Rendeja vineyard with a 10% contribution from Viña Alta, all aged in new American barrels, this is dense, smoky and rich, with toast and dried coconut aromas, some floral top notes, enticing Asian spices, dark berry and liquorice flavours and impressive structure and palate length. 2024-35



#### Hacienda Solano Finca Cascorrales Cosecha 2018

#### (14.5%)

Finca Cascorrales is generally the firmer and denser of the two single parcel wines from this family-owned bodega in La Aguilera. The vineyard itself is more than 120 years' old and is located on stony, red clay and silex soils. Wild and intense, with garrigue aromas, sappy blackberry and black fig flavours, savoury tannins and a frame of scented oak. 2024-32



#### Hermanos Sastre Pago de Santa Cruz Cosecha 2020

(14.5%)

One of two wines released under the Pago de Santa Cruz label, this comes from seven microparcels within the 77-year-old vineyard on predominantly limestone soils. Matured in new American oak, it's rich, dense and beautifully wooded, with notes of dark chocolate, orange zest and blackberry fruit and smooth, fine-grained tannins. Still young. 2025-35



#### La Loba Cosecha 2019

(14%)

La Loba hails from four villages to the north of the Duero river in Soria - Matanza, Quintanilla, Rejas and Villálvaro - and is one of my favourite reds from the region. Showing the refined touch of Ana Carazo's winemaking, this has aromas of tobacco leaf and Mediterranean herbs, fine-grained tannins, a hint of rose petal and a fresh, acidity-driven finish. 2023-30



#### Legaris Alcubilla de Avellaneda Cosecha 2018

#### (15%)

"Cold soils in a cold place" is how Jorge Bombín describes this 20-year-old parcel on red clay at 926 metres. Aged in a combination of French and American oak and concrete, this is ripe yet refreshing, with cigar box and five spice aromas, dense, plum and black cherry fruit and the bright acidity that's typical of Soria reds. 2023-30



### Legaris Gumiel de Mercado Cosecha 2019 $({}_{15}\%)$

New to Legaris' Selección de Viñedos range in 2019, this hails from a comparatively youthful, clay-rich vineyard at 910 metres in Gumiel de Mercado. Matured in 225 and 500-litre French oak, it's spicy and intensely aromatic, with bright acidity, violet and peony aromas, plum and bramble fruit and understated concentration. 2024-32



#### M. Chapoutier España Dominio del Soto Reserva 2019

(14.5%)

Made with selected lots in the cellar rather than from specific vineyard blocks, this is a youthful but extremely complex Tinto Fino from this French-owned but Spanish-run operation. Lavender and rosemary aromas segue into a palate that's tangy, chalky and well structured, with high-altitude acidity and vivid dark berry fruit. 2024-32



#### Magna Vides Fuente del Zorro Cosecha 2020

#### (14%)

Not far behind its stablemate, Bancales del Sardal, in quality, this hails from another historic ungrafted vineyard in La Aguilera, planted at the turn of the 20th century and running to 0.7 of a hectare. Savoury and chalky, with plenty of underlying structure, some clove spice from whole bunches and racy redcurrant and pomegranate flavours. 2024-32



#### Magna Vides Cosecha 2020

(13.5%)

Peppery, spicy and almost northern Rhône-like in terms of aroma and structure, this stylish whole bunch-fermented blend of Tinto Fino and 5% Albillo Mayor hails from two parcels in La Aguilera - Sotillejo and El Sardal. Wild, savoury and complex, with medium body, savoury tannins and plenty of zip and acidity. 2024-30



#### Mélida Wines Eternauta Cosecha 2021

(14.5%)

An impressive follow up to the maiden vintage of Eternauta, this stylish, three-barrel Tinto Fino hails from a 70-year-old, limestone-rich parcel at 940 metres in the remote village of Milagros. Fermented with 40% whole bunches, with no new oak in the mix, it has lovely focus and freshness, some clove and thyme top notes, subtle reduction and a bright, sappy finish. 2023-29



#### Quinta Milú Bellavista Cosecha 2019

#### (14%)

Vines over 80 years' old on gravel supply the raw material for this serious, intense, concentrated Tinto Fino that shows the structure of the best 2019 reds. Grippy and deeply coloured, it has scented vanilla oak, fine-grained tannins, top notes of rosemary and Asian spices and a core of acidity and dark berry fruit. 2023-30



#### Quinta Milú Viñas Viejas Cosecha 2019

(14%)

Quinta Milú's Viñas Viejas bottling comes from two centenary vineyards in La Aguilera, known as Tío Paco and Tío Pedro, or the two uncles. This is every inch a 2019 Ribera, with aromas of incense and wild herbs, bold, grippy tannins, lots of fruit power and concentration and refreshing, chalky minerality. 2023-30



#### Tomás Postigo Vinificación Integral Cosecha 2017

#### (15%)

Barrel-fermented in French oak barrels, hence the name "vinificación integral", this wine is made with a selection of the bodega's best vineyard parcels each year. Partnering Tinto Fino with 10% Cabernet Sauvignon and 5% each of Merlot and Malbec, this sees a total of 200% new oak (one barrel follows another, as it were), but possesses the requisite power, density, acidity and tannic backbone to cope. Will age very well. You just need to be patient. 2026-35



#### Tr3smano TM Cosecha 2018

(14.5%)

TM comes from a 100-year-old vineyard on the border between Anguix and La Horra. Now in its fourth vintage, it's a serious, full-bodied Tinto Fino that shows its low yields. The new French oak is very well handled, framing the layered, perfumed fruit. Fresh despite the power and weight, this has chalky minerality, dark berry flavours and a balsamic lift. 2023-30



#### Valdemonjas Los Tres Dones Cosecha 2020

(14.5%)

Los Tres Dones is an organically farmed Tinto Fino that combines grapes from Valdemonjas' El Balcón and Galeria parcels in Quintanilla de Arriba and El Nogal de la Valera in La Horra, each of which has a different terroir. Aged in one-third new wood, this has lots of chalky freshness, layers of dark berry fruit, a ferrous undertone and deftly handled oak sweetness and structure. 2023-30



#### Viñedos y Bodegas García Figuero Tinto Figuero Tinus Cosecha 2019

Aged in new French oak - something that seems to go with more elevated prices in Ribera del Duero - García Figuero's icon red uses grapes from three parcels in the Fuente Gorrión area to the north of the village of La Horra. Intense, firm and complex, with lots of toast, mocha and wood spices and a core of damson, blackberry and dried herbs. 2025-35

Lees-aged in concrete and 500 litre barrels, it's taut, tangy and refreshing with a herbal, almost Sauvignon Blanc like tang, lots of minerality and a twist of aniseed spice. 2022-27



#### **Bodegas Vizcarra Alejandra Albillo Mayor Cosecha 2020** (13%)

Old vines in Mambrilla de Castrejón and Roa de Duero supply the grapes for this first release of an Albillo Mayor from Juan Carlos Vizcarra. Fermented and aged in a combination of concrete and French oak, with 24 hours of skin maceration at the start, it has oatmeal, lemongrass and citrus peel flavours and a waxy, lees-influenced mid palate. 2022-28



#### Casa Lebai La Nava Albillo Mayor Cosecha 2019

# One of the discoveries of my tastings at the Consejo Regulador this year. Casa Lebai is the personal project of brothers Rodrigo and Asier Calo, whose parents own Bodegas Arrocal. Stylishly packaged, this comes from an 82-year-old vineyard that's co-planted with Albillo Mayor and 10% of other "ancestral" varieties. Textured and leesy, with some wood spices, yellow apple and grapefruit flavours and appealing palate length. 2023-27



#### Dominio del Pidio Albillo Mayor Cosecha 2021

Óscar Aragón has got a better handle on Albillo Mayor than almost anyone in Ribera del Duero, using old vine plots on a combination of clay, limestone and sandy soils to produce a wine of lovely poise and balance. Mealy and complex, with subtle wood, citrus peel fruit and a salty, yeasty finish. 2023-28



#### Tr3smano Albillo Mayor Cosecha 2021

#### (13%)

Pedro Aibar seems to understand the foibles of Albillo Mayor as well as anyone. This Burgundian style interpretation of Ribera del Duero's signature white grape hails from Nava de Roa and Olmedillo and is savoury, leesy and salty, with struck match complexity, beeswax and wild mushroom undertones and finely balanced oak. 2023-28
